I see no problem in asking if a person has a religious affiliation first, then if they do, asking what it is. To my thinking that is a more logical and efficient way to gather the data.

I do see the question as fraught though. Taking the Jewish community as an example, many Jews identify on a cultural or ethnic basis as Jewish, but not on a religious basis. So if you were to only ask a non-religious Jew if they had a religious affiliation and they responded honestly, that would mean they don't get the opportunity to identify their Jewish cultural affiliation, assuming

there was no other place to provide feedback on their cultural/ethnic community affiliation.
